Are Your Trees Ready to Thrive This Spring? Here's How to Tell.

Just like you, your trees should have an annual "physical." Early spring is the best time to look them over for winter damage and other signs of potential problems. When issues are caught and addressed early in the active growing season, your trees are much more likely to stay healthy, strong, and beautiful.



Here are three areas to assess:

Base of the Tree

- Mushrooms or conks at the base or along root flares (the part of the root system that's visible above ground)
- Cracked or raised soil on one side of the tree

Trunk & Branches

- Cracks or breaks along branches or where branches attach to trunk
- Branches growing from the trunk at a narrow angle
- Oozing wounds
- Missing bark
- Hollowing or any kind of cavity in the trunk or limbs
- Large dead or hanging branches

Foliage

- Uneven leaf distribution
- Unhealthy color
- Stunted leaves

March - April Lawn Care

Application #2 for all programs.

Please note: There are times when we may need to modify the treatments we apply due to weather.

LAWN TREATMENTS

Weed Control

All Programs. We applied the second treatment of the year, pre-emergent and broadleaf weed controls, to all lawns. The pre-emergent blocks the development of crabgrass and many other grassy weeds. (Unfortunately, no treatment is currently available that will target all grassy weeds.) The broadleaf weed control will cause these weeds to yellow and die off over the next two weeks.

Silver Plus & Gold Plus. All lawns received an additional grassy-weed treatment that targets nutsedge.

Platinum. For lawns that have clump grass (for example, clumps of Fescue growing in a Bermuda lawn), we applied a treatment that minimizes the unwanted grass.

Fertilization

All Programs. We applied Arbor-Nomics Special Blend fertilizer to nourish turf during the growing season.

Fungus Control

Silver Plus, Gold Plus & Platinum. We applied a fungicide to help prevent brown patch and dollar spot, two common fungal diseases.

Pest Control

Gold, Gold Plus & Platinum. We sprayed a protective barrier of our Outdoor Pest Control around your yard and in key breeding areas (such as ground cover) to control ants, fleas, ticks, and spiders.

Aeration

Platinum. We will be aerating lawns with warm-season grasses in April and May. If you're not on the Platinum program, call for a FREE estimate and to schedule this vital service.

ORNAMENTAL TREE AND SHRUB TREATMENTS

Fungus & Insect Controls

Gold, Gold Plus & Platinum. We applied a fungicide to help prevent leaf spot, powdery mildew, and other fungal diseases and an insecticide to control aphids, lace bugs, and leafhoppers.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO UNTIL OUR NEXT VISIT

Schedule Your Lawn Aeration.

Lawns with warm-season grasses, such as Bermuda and Zoysia, should be aerated each spring. If you're not on our Platinum program, call us for a FREE estimate and to schedule your service.

Mow at the Right Height.

Be careful not to remove more than one-third of the grass blade at each cutting. It's safe to mow the same day we treat, and we recommend leaving grass clippings on the lawn. They recycle back into the soil, giving it an extra dose of nutrients.

Myth or Fact? April Showers Bring May Flowers

There's often some grain of truth in most old sayings, and "April showers bring May flowers" is no exception. While April rain won't cause flowers to appear where they aren't already planted, rainwater is more beneficial for flowers – and all plants – than most people think.

Rainwater is better than tap water. Rain provides valuable minerals to growing flowers that are not found in water delivered through a sprinkler system. Furthermore, tap water contains fluoride and chlorine, neither of which benefit plants. In fact, nearly all plants are susceptible to chlorine toxicity, which appears as burnt margins on leaves.

Rain cleanses leaves. A rain shower is literally a shower for plants, removing debris from leaves and enabling the plants to perform photosynthesis more effectively.

Rainwater washes away damaging salts. If a sufficient amount of these salts sink into soil beyond the root zone of the grass, the resulting build-up will inhibit plant growth.

Want to give your plants the gift of rainwater? Consider getting some rain barrels. It's the perfect way to conserve water and to give both your indoor and outdoor plants a drink that truly refreshes.

Springtime Mower Maintenance: 5 Must-Do Items

A few spring rainstorms, and the next thing you know, your grass is growing like – dare we say – weeds. It's important not to let grass get too tall before mowing, because when you finally do mow, you'll end up removing much of the rich green section of the grass blade and exposing the paler green (or even brownish) lower portion.

To make sure your mower is ready to keep your lawn looking its best, we put together a spring maintenance checklist with five items all homeowners should do.

Change the Oil. This should be done after 50 hours of use or at least once a year (whichever comes first). Running time and seasonal temperature changes cause the oil to degrade, which in turn, reduces the mower's performance and lifespan.

Replace the Spark Plug. This should be done after 100 hours of use. A dirty or fouled spark plug can make starting the mower difficult or prevent it from starting at all.

Check the Air Filter. Most filters will need to be cleaned or replaced every three months or at the start of each season. Check the manual to see whether your mower uses a

filter that can be cleaned and reused or one that needs to be replaced.

Clean & Lubricate Moving Parts. Even if you thoroughly cleaned your mower before winter storage, it's a good idea to check for any debris that you might have missed or that accumulated during storage. Once it's clean, follow the manufacturer's directions for lubricating moving parts.

Sharpen the Blade. A dull mower blade tears grass instead of cutting it, which causes the other kind of blade to brown at the tips. If you'd rather not take on this task yourself, you can have it done professionally.
